Saturday, February 9, 1:30 PM is the day Democrats have their say.

The Eleventh Legislative District Democrats will host fourteen locations. Your Voting Precinct will convene at one of these. Starting from the North on Beacon Hill democracy will hold forth at: Asa Mercer Middle School, Van Asselt Elementary, Beverly Park at Glendale, Hill Top Elementary, Hazel Valley Elementary, Foster High School, Tukwila Elementary, Renton Carpenter's Hall, Highlands Elementary, Renton Technical College, Tiffany Park Elementary, Nelsen Middle School, Renton Park Elementary, and Benson Hill Elementary.
