### WSDCC quarterly meeting January 23th and 24th in Olympia

Election of WSDCC officers

Mark Mintz of the Snohomish County Democrats ran for chair against Dwight Pelz. The final vote was Pelz 98, Mintz 64 and 4 abstentions.

Sharon Smith of Spokane challenged incumbent Vice-Chair Eileen Macoll and won 107 to 59.

Secretary Luis Moscoso and Treasurer Habib Habib were elected without opposition. Habib is now being open about his middle name "Hussein."

Elections Committee, Communications Committee, Affirmative Action Committee

Rules Committee Technology Committee memberships have not been reassigned yet, owing to the very recent election of committeemen and women.

The previous chair of the Technology Committee mentioned that Washington State has 10 times the average number of VoteBuilder PCO accounts. There is a substantial amount of new data from 2008 that has not yet been integrated into VoteBuilder. Given that state party resources, like budgets everywhere, are under serious stress, we will need to ask for more resources from the Democratic National Committee. I spoke with DNC representatives Lona Wilbur and Sharon Mast about trying to find out which DNC members are working on technology. Apparently our national organization does not have a technology committee. I find this disturbing, and I feel a resolution or two coming on.

DNC reports

Dave McDonald is on the Rules Committee. Donna Brazile is in charge of ongoing voter registration. New Chair Tim Kaine gave a speech partly in fluent Spanish.

Ed Cote is on the Executive Committee. There was a substantial amount of electoral analysis. Obama has turned over his supporters list to the DNC, which plans to make a priority of keeping newly active people involved. There was lavish praise of Howard Dean, and a commitment by incoming chair Tim Kaine.

Sharon Mast is on the Resolutions Committee. There was effective microtargeting of voters in 2008. There were 24 million new voters under 20, and 13 million names on the volunteer email list. The DNC raised \$330 million as well.
